Staff Report:

Town Superintendent James Steward reported to the council that he had attended a Drought Watch meeting and that the town is under a Drought Warning.

Town Administrator Brinson reported that she had a meeting with VDOT and that they have 30 days to begin the project. Mrs. Brinson informed the council that June 27th would be the scheduled shed painting day. Mrs. Brinson informed the council that Fauquier Fish would like to use the parking lot after hours to distribute food, which may be once every few months. Brinson also informed the council that the Car Wash and Remington Drug received a grant from Fauquier County Economic Development grant from improvements.

Revitalization:

Council member Moxley reported that revitalization efforts are currently on hold.

Finance:

Council member Heflin reported to the council that the end of fiscal year 26 was approaching and that the Town may end the fiscal year with a positive outcome. Heflin also reported that the Fiscal year 2027 budget had been approved.

Comprehensive Planning:

Council member Heflin reported that the Comprehensive Planning Committee was in the process of compiling information related to land use and transportation. Heflin encouraged everyone to attend the upcoming meetings and advised that the next public engagement opportunity will take place during the Remington Fall Festival.

ACI:

Administrator Brinson informed the Council that the deadline to discontinue services with ACI was July 1, 2026.

Council member Tiemens motioned to discontinue the contract with ACI as of July 1, 2026, and the town will continue to use ACI through the end of the year or until a new provider is implemented.
